Estimated Living Costs	
Room and Board Costs	University housing and mandatory meal plan are approximately US\$7,500 persemester (Approximately 260,000 Thai Baht)
Living Costs	Textbooks and personal expenses are approximately US\$2,500 per semester (Approximately 85,000 Thai Baht)
Insurance Costs	The NJCU international student insurance policy is about US\$120 per month. Students will be billed US\$480 (Approximately 16,500 Thai Baht) for the Fall semester (4 months) and US\$600 (Approximately 20,500 Thai Baht) for the Spring semester (5 months)
