



New Jersey City University Exchange Program Overview

Application Procedure	
Academic Requirements	Students must have completed at least one semester in the Assumption University. Students should normally be in at least their second year of school and should have at least a “C” average or equivalent.
English Proficiency for Non-Native English Speakers	Students must meet NJCU’s English proficiency requirements: <ul style="list-style-type: none">❖ TOEFL 69-79❖ IELTS 5.5- 6.5❖ B2 level of English proficiency according to the Common European Framework Students/ schools can submit alternate documentation of English proficiency NJCU does not have a full time English as a Second Language Program. Students cannot be admitted only for English study
Semester Begin	SPRING (January- May) FALL (September – December)
Application Process	Nominated students will receive an email directing them to the NJCU webpage with the exchange student application and other required documents. https://www.njcu.edu/admissions-aid/international-students/how-apply/visiting- exchange-students All materials should be submitted electronically to inbound-exchange@njcu.edu
Visa Information	All students coming to the US for study must have an F1 or J1 visa. Information on the visa process can be found at: https://www.njcu.edu/admissions-aid/international-students/information- accepted-students/applying-visa
Insurance and Immunizations	All visiting students are required to have health insurance that meets US State Department standards. Alternatives to the University policy will only be approved if they contain equivalent coverage. Certain immunizations are also required and documentation must be submitted prior to the student’s arrival. Housing

University Housing	Exchange students are required to live in University Housing. Requests for housing waivers will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.
Application Process	After a student is admitted and registered for classes, they will be directed to the University housing application website. Estimated Living Costs

Room and Board Costs	University housing and mandatory meal plan are approximately US\$7,500 per semester (Approximately 260,000 Thai Baht)
Living Costs	Textbooks and personal expenses are approximately US\$2,500 per semester (Approximately 85,000 Thai Baht)
Insurance Costs	The NJCU international student insurance policy is about US\$120 per month . Students will be billed US\$480 (Approximately 16,500 Thai Baht) for the Fall semester (4 months) and US\$600 (Approximately 20,500 Thai Baht) for the Spring semester (5 months)

Academic Information

Full-Time Study	Minimum undergraduate study load per semester: 12 credits (typically 4 classes)
Attendance Requirements	All students, including exchange students, are expected to attend all scheduled classes and activities. Attendance is part of grades.
Class Selection	All nominated students will receive information on choosing classes after their application materials are received and processed.

Transcripts	Transcripts are usually available about 3 weeks after the semester ends. Two copies of official transcripts will be sent to the student's home institution.
