Name in English	Seisen University, Tokyo, Japan
School Introduction	<p>Seisen University is a Catholic liberal arts university focusing in particular on women's education, located in the central area of Tokyo.</p> <p>From April 2025, we'll have 2 faculties as follows; Faculty of Humanities, Faculty of Global Citizenship Studies. Exchange students are enrolled in one of the faculties; however, they have the liberty of selecting classes across different faculties, following their interdisciplinary study plan.</p> <p>Furthermore, the convenient location of Seisen, in the heart of Tokyo, will facilitate students' enjoyment that Tokyo can offer!</p>
Academic Year	<p>1st (Spring) semester: Apr 1, 2025 – Sep 26, 2025 <i>*Classes will be held from the mid-April through the end of July.</i></p> <p>2nd (Fall) semester: Sep 27, 2025 – Mar 31, 2026 <i>*Classes will be held from September 27 through the end of January.</i></p>

Japanese Language Course	<p>We provide 4 classes of Japanese as a second language for international students per semester: grammar, reading, speaking, and comprehensive Japanese. (total 8 credits per semester, free of charge)</p> <p>For more information, Click here.</p>
Transcript offered	A transcript will be provided to each home institution.

Language Requirement	Applicants who earn credits primarily in Japanese are required to have JLPT N2 or equivalent level.
Scholarship for Exchange Students	<p>【Seisen Reisen-kai Scholarship】 Upon recommendation by a partner university or college, this scholarship is offered to one student per partner institution.</p> <p>The amount is ¥40,000 for the candidate per month. This scholarship will be offered for 10 months (one year exchange), or 5 months (one semester exchange).</p> <p>Students who receive other scholarships of an amount equivalent to 80,000 Japanese yen or more will not receive the scholarship. No more than one student may be awarded scholarships per institution at the same time.</p>
Accommodation	<p>Seisen University doesn't have official student dormitories. Students' Support	<p>【Academic Advisor & Student Buddy】 Each student is assigned an academic advisor and a buddy student.</p> <p>【SEISEN AMIGAS】 Members of SEISEN AMIGAS (volunteer student staffs of International Center) plan lots of activities for international students to experience Japanese culture and make friends with other students.</p> <p>【Wellness Center】 Wellness Center is staffed with health care professionals and counselors to support students for physical and mental health. The services include medical and health consultations, and first aid, counseling in mental health, career planning, human relations, and so forth.</p> <p>【Career Support Center】 Career Support Center provides information on part-time jobs in Tokyo and supports exchange students who are considering employment in Japan in the future.</p>

Facilities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ All facilities at Seisen campus are available to exchange students. ▪ Seisen University is a member of "The Campus Members Program" offered by National Art Museums and National Theatres. Students are eligible for free admission to regular exhibitions, and also receive additional discounts on special exhibitions. 	
Insurance	<p>All international students are strongly recommended to have overseas travel insurance for health, accident and personal properties before coming to Japan.</p> <p>In addition, all students who will stay in Japan longer than 3 months are required to join the National Health Insurance in Japan. Approximately 70% of their medical expenses will be covered by the National Health Insurance.</p>	
Suggested Arrival Date and Orientation Date	<p>Orientation date for the 1st (Spring) semester: Early April, 2025 Orientation date for the 2nd (Fall) semester: Late September, 2025 Check-in date of dormitory: TBA</p>	
Airport Pick-up Service	<p>It is available only for students who arranged their housing through Seisen University. It is preferable to arrive at the airport between 10:00 and 13:00, taking into account the time of entry into the dormitory.</p>
