Course Load (per week)	Exchange students must register and attend more than 10 hours of classes per week. To fulfill this requirement, registering and attending at least 7 periods every week is necessary.			
Credits at KGU	One Credit Hour (Actual Teaching Hours) Language Course 22.5 hours Lectures & Seminars 11.25 hours Exchange students cannot register for more than 24 KGU credits per semester.			
KG Buddies	Acting as partners the exchange student's first semester, KGU local student volunteers assist the exchange students in their life on and off campus.			
Global Student (GS) Network	The GS Network is the official student group endorsed by CIEC and provides various supports to exchange students during orientation. They also plan and hold cultural exchange activities for both exchange students and KGU students over the course of the year.
