Academic Year	1st semester: Apr - Jul (Aug-Mid Sep: Summer Vacation) 2nd semester: Sep – Jan (Feb-Mar: Spring Vacation)  The exchange period starts in either April or September. First semester: April-August Second semester: September-March of the following year.  Lengths of courses are set for either a full year (April to January) or a semester (the first semester is April to July and the second semester is September to January).  A full year courses can also be enrolled in from September.

Regarding Japanese language ability, successful candidates must satisfy either of the following requirements in principle:
1) have studied Japanese for 2 years or more before coming to Gakushuin
2) have passed the Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) Level N4 or to have the equivalent ability
*We supplement its Exchange Programme with a Japanese Language Preparatory Course (JLPC) for prospective exchange
students who have not reached the Japanese proficiency level we require for exchange students. For more details: click <u>here</u> .
* Students applying to the Faculty of International Social Sciences must also meet either of the following requirements in addition to above Japanese language ability:  1) be native speakers of English  2) All traducts
